




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### HEAD OF SECONDARY (INTERIM) MESSAGE

The programme will commence with our prospective medical students, who will have the opportunity to practice their interview skills with experienced doctors.




We are incredibly grateful to our dedicated parents and Friends of DBS who have helped us connect with the wider professional community to make this important initiative and experience possible.

### A Successful Event for Year 13 and Year 12 Students





We're excited to see our young engineers grow and shape the world around them!






