"Of course, summer is a time to take a break from school and study, but you often find yourself with a vast amount of spare time in it - spare time that can very easily be used to get ahead of the pack and give yourself a head start in the new school year.


Abdulla has created notes with diagrams, definitions and examples for IGCSE Mathematics. He has shared his folder with his classmates so they can benefit also.






















### **DBS Lions**

We are looking for ambitious and enthusiastic young talents who are ready to star in a leading role for this film. Please find the information below:


Project name: Light to Ashes
