

Dear Parents,

I hope this letter finds you well. I am writing to inform you about a recent directive from the Ministry of Education and Higher Education (MoEHE) that will affect the school uniform requirements for all private schools starting in the new academic year on 1st September 2024. The changes are minimal for students at Doha British School (DBS), it is important that all parents and students are aware of and prepared for these adjustments.

The change concerns the uniform requirements for girls from Year 7 upwards in secondary school. Girls will be required to cover their arms and legs as part of their school attire. To accommodate this directive, DBS and our uniform supplier, Zaks, have introduced the following solutions:

- Upper Body: Girls can add a second layered skin or opt for a longer-sleevedshirt to cover their arms. They may also continue wearing the long-sleeved jumper, fleece, or blazer, as prescribed in the DBS Uniform.
- Lower Body: Girls will be required to wear tights or long socks with their skirts, or they can choose to wear trousers instead. Girls in secondary who choose to wear trousers are required to have the shirt untucked per the image below and attached.

In addition to these changes, the PE uniform for girls from Year 4 in primary school and above has been updated to include:

- Upper Body: Girls need to wear a long-sleeved top or a long-sleeved second layer to be worn under the PE top.
- Lower Body: DBS School PE shorts + Dark coloured Leggings or DBS jogging pants to be worn by girls.

For swimwear, all students are required to wear long or short-sleeved tops, along with bottoms that reach at or below the knee.

Please find the updated DBS uniform available from our supplier Zaks attached and linked below for your convenience. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in adhering to these new requirements to ensure that we comply with the MoEHE directive.

Should you have any questions or require further information, please do not hesitate to contact the school administration.

This is a reminder that students who joined the school during the 2021-22 academic year and may still be wearing parts of the old uniform will be expected to fully transition to the new uniform introduced in September 2022. This change will take effect from September 2024.

Whilst students are at DBS, we aim to develop and instill the following values:












