Attendance Update

A reminder that our learning at school starts daily at 7:10am. Gates open at 6:45am to give children the chance to be settled and ready for this. Once the registers are closed, your child will either be marked as late or absent and this will affect their overall attendance.

Statistics show that children with good attendance have higher attainment in school and studies show that children with attendance above 95% make better progress socially and academically. With the focus and development on the curriculum that has taken place at school then children who are absent will find gaps in their sequential knowledge.

For our children in EYFS and Year 1, both attendance and punctuality are doubly important as they move straight into their phonics and guided reading at 7:10am.

Year 2: We are learning about instruments in the woodwind section of the orchestra.


Year 3: We are learning about vocal timbre in music.
