#### Red Lanyard - Compulsory requirement

Thank you for ensuring that you enter the school premises with a red lanyard, or by showing appropriate identification to obtain a yellow visitor's lanyard. I would like to remind you that this policy is in place to ensure the safety and security of all our community members, especially our children, by ensuring that all personnel on site are authorised.

#### Please note the following:

• To avoid being stopped by security, ensure your lanyard is visible upon entry and while you remain on the premises.



- If you do not have a red lanyard for any reason, one can be obtained from the reception desk.
- If you have applied for a red lanyard but are still awaiting your card, you may collect a red lanyard from reception, and later pick up your card once it is ready.

- Despite security and support staff knowing you, there is no guarantee that all staff on site are familiar with you, particularly after you have dropped off your child. Therefore, please keep your lanyards visible at all times.


## **SCIENCE SPOTLIGHT**

# **PLANT CELLS**

Year 7 and Year 11 students independently prepared plant cells for observation under a microscope. The Year 7 students focused on understanding resolution and resolving power—the ability to see one line as two distinct lines—while calculating the magnification of their images. They did this by combining the optical resolution of the eyepiece lens with the resolving power of three different objective lenses. Importantly, they observed some of the fundamental organelles of the plant cell using a layer of onion.

Additionally, the Year 10 students had the opportunity to create a plant cell that had undergone plasmolysis, which is the gradual disintegration of the cell membrane due to loss of water.

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### Medical Information






